Think of a time when someone's words stuck with you and resonated deeply. What made their message effective, and how can you apply that model to your own communication?

Reflect on a time when you avoided addressing an important issue. Why didn't you act, and what was the cost of that avoidance, for both you and the other person?

Now think of 1-2 interactions where you're proud of how you communicated. What approaches or tactics made them successful? How can you turn these strategies into consistent habits and patterns that shape your future interactions?
